

Attendance

You must attend classes regularly and punctually. An instructor may treat a student who misses or arrives late for 25%, or more, of the class meetings as excessively absent or tardy. Excessive absence or tardiness may result in sanctions from the instructor, including prohibition from taking the exam, a failing grade for the course, or a grade penalty in the course.

Instructors may announce additional possible sanctions or a stricter standard regarding attendance or tardiness in the syllabus or course policies at the beginning of the semester. This stricter standard may include dropping a student from the course if that student fails to attend the first day of class.

With approval from the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, an instructor may also remove a student from a course for excessive absence or tardiness.

The School of Law may dismiss a student for excessive absence from multiple courses.
