## Credit for Courses Taken at Another Law School (adopted March 23, 2022)

With advance permission from the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs, a law student may receive transfer credit for course work at another law school accredited by the ABA. You must obtain this permission before the start of the course work at the other school.

You may receive only Z-credit for credits earned at another school. The course must be graded, and you must receive a grade of 2.0 (C) or better (or the equivalent) in order to receive credit. These hours count as regularly-graded classroom hours if appropriate. You may receive up to 30 hours of credit under this policy.

You must supply the Registrar with appropriate information from the other school's registrar in order to receive credit.
