

Purpose and Rules of Ole Miss Law C.A.R.E.S.

The sole purpose of ‘The Ole Miss Law C.A.R.E.S. Committee’ is to allow Alumni, Faculty and Staff, as well as currently enrolled Students of the Ole Miss Law School, the opportunity to reach out in meaningful and compassionate ways to those who have requested assistance due to experiencing a sudden catastrophic loss caused by such events as medical emergencies, fires, tornadoes, or hurricanes.

Alumni, Faculty, Staff and Students can request help for themselves, their family members, office staff, paralegals, etc. by simply sending an email to the C.A.R.E.S. Committee. All emails received will be handled with sensitivity and as much confidentiality as possible, noting that such things as age, gender, geographic location and a certain amount of information as to the background of the need may be disclosed in order to better describe the issue. An alert will then be drafted by the Committee and sent to all participants. Depending on the need, assistance can run the full gamut from simply providing the name of a physician who provides specialized services, to the request for a used motorized wheelchair, or a place to stay after the loss or damage to a home. The C.A.R.E.S. Committee will not request cash contributions, offer the opportunity for public service announcements, operate as an employment recruitment service, operate as a site to sell items, or give political opinions. In fact, there will be no “open” posting of emails. All emails will be sent to and from the C.A.R.E.S. Committee.

The C.A.R.E.S. Committee anticipates sending out a very small number (2-3) of emails per month. Anyone can opt out of these emails at any time by following “unsubscribe” directions which will be located at the bottom of the email.
